 What is above me?
- · Right or Left Hand Search
- · Maintain Situational Awareness



- · Don't Excessively Move Furniture
- · Be Aware of Your Surroundings.




Large Area Search

Urgent and MAYDAY

- When Transmitted, All Radio Traffic Should Cease
- Should Be Transmitted Three Times
- MAYDAY Has Priority Over Urgent
- · Incorporated Into SOP's
- For True Emergency Situations Only.

• Back Out, Discontinue Interior Attack

- Loss of Water
- · Injury To Member, Non-Life Threatening
- Feared Collapse
- <mark>=</mark>xposure Problem
- · Environment Change, Severe.

Sequence

 Emergency alert activation button (if available)

 Emergency transmission: MAYDAY, MAYDAY, MAYDAY

 Provide information, <u>receive</u> <u>acknowledgment</u>

Activate PASS (if you are lost / trapped).





Let's Be Realistic

- \leq **Black Sunday Audio**
- **Statistics**
- We have fire above our heads." Heard 82% of the time before a <mark>...</mark>
- 79 seconds average time for MAYDAY acknowledgment.
- $_{\circ}$ 77% of firefighters involved in a MAYDAY reported Situational Awareness (or lack of) as a factor.
- 87% of the time a MAYDAY was solved through self-rescue (36%) or from assistance from the firefighter's crew (26%) or another nearby crew (25%). Billy G ine (2019)

Summary

- Searches must be conducted in a systematic and oriented fashion
- Search rope operations, to include large area searches, are difficult and must be practiced
- Criteria for an Urgent message include the acronym BLIFEE.

Summary (Cont'd)

- Criteria for MAYDAY messages include the acronym URACuteLiTtleMouse
- LUNAR is an acronym used to gained additional information regarding a lost or missing firefighter

• Emergency communications as well as roll-calls must be practiced.
