

SCFA – Training Bulletin 23-03

Rapid Intervention Teams (RIT's)

5 to 6 firefighters / Can operate in smaller multi-functioned teams / Experienced members (**RIT Qualified**) / Full PPE and SCBA w/ various forcible entry, search, and packaging tools

Open Arrival – Report to command post READY TO WORK / Remind IC you are the RIT

While Standing Fast – Conduct a size-up (360° but w/o freelancing) / Ensure portable ladder placement / “Soften” the building / Continually monitor radio transmissions and progress of the fire (TIC from outside)

Upon Activation – 6-Sided Approach / Where might/should the member be based on riding position / Best access / Status of the hose-lines

Remember – THE FIRE MUST STILL BE FOUGHT, ESPECIALLY DURING A MAYDAY SITUATION / When the fire is out, things typically get better

PASS Activated? – reset the PASS (noise = chaos)

Air Status – face-piece on/off, purge, FAST PAK

Communicate – MAYDAY, MAYDAY, MAYDAY,
C.A.N. Report

Package – SCBA into a Harness, DRD, Webbing

Move – nearest exit may not be the way you entered
