## **SCFA – Training Bulletin** 23-03 Rapid Intervention Teams (RIT's)

5 to 6 firefighters / Can operate in smaller mutifunctioned teams / Experienced members (RIT Qualified) / Full PPE and SCBA w/ various forcible entry, search, and packaging tools

**Open Arrival – Report to command post <u>READY TO</u> <u>WORK</u> / Remind IC you are the RIT** 

While Standing Fast – Conduct a size-up (360° but w/o freelancing) / Ensure portable ladder placement / "Soften" the building / Continually monitor radio transmissions and progress of the fire (TIC from outside)

Upon Activation – <u>6-Sided Approach</u> / Where might/should the member be based on riding position / Best access / Status of the hose-lines

**Remember** – <u>THE FIRE MUST STILL BE FOUGHT</u>, <u>ESPECIALLY DURING A MAYDAY SITUATION</u> / When the fire is out, things typically get better

## **Locating A Downed Member**

**PASS Activated?** – reset the PASS (noise = chaos)

Air Status – face-piece on/off, purge, FAST PAK

Communicate – MAYDAY, MAYDAY, MAYDAY, C.A.N. Report

**Package – SCBA into a Harness, DRD, Webbing** 

Move – nearest exit may not be the way you entered
